Prize Giving

Below is the text of the Head Teacher's report to our long awaited prize giving which was held on Wednesday last week. A full list of prize-winners is attached to this newsletter:

Under normal circumstances we would have had prize giving in July and ended the term with a celebration of our pupil's achievement. Six weeks of summer holiday later we would have been back full of tales of what we did in the holiday.

These are not normal circumstances. On the 20th of March we sent all our pupils and staff home and started working on line. I know that our closure for Covid-19 and our on-line learning as a result has been a source of stress for some of our pupils and that the very sudden enforced move to a virtual curriculum was not easy. I want to commend the pupils for the real efforts they made in those weeks to keep up with the work being set by teachers. Some of you really worked incredibly hard and I know you will feel the benefit now that we are back at school.

I also want to thank the parents for all their support in this time, without your encouragement and perseverance the job would be a lot more difficult.

Our teaching staff also worked incredibly hard over these weeks to provide a high standard of work and support to all our pupils and I thank them sincerely for their efforts.

Many of our support staff have also gone beyond what we could reasonably expect in such difficult times to provide extra support for our pupils and to ensure that they were all safe and well even if they were not able to connect with on-line learning. We

are now back. It is different. Routines have changed and we need to develop new habits. Hand washing and personal hygiene is vital if we are to prevent the spread of this deadly virus. I do not wish to be overly alarmist but we must take precautions. People are dying because of this and while we in Scotland and in the Highlands have been fortunate to avoid the scale of infection which has happened elsewhere we cannot afford to be complacent. Please continue to exercise care and keep your distance as much as possible.

At a normal prize giving I would be looking forward to exam results. Even if I had been standing here in July that would not have been the case. There were no exams and in spite of some early concerns about the results we now know that the estimated grades we provided after a long and careful process have been accepted. This means that we have the results which our pupils deserved this year and we are delighted with the successes of our 54, 5 and 6 from last year. Well done to all of you.

At prize giving we say farewell to some and we welcome others. Tom, Roan and Ross left us this year and we send them off to the next stage in their lives with all our best wishes. Ross to pursue an apprenticeship with Loch Duart Fish Farms, Roan to Glasgow University to study Spanish and Tom to the University of the West of Scotland to study Physics. It is good to see you here today. Keep in touch and let us know how life beyond Kinlochbervie High School works out.

Mrs Jarvis moved on to pastures new, or at least back to Golspie. She has been a truly valuable and valued member of staff in the years she has been with us and we will miss her greatly but she leaves with our very best wishes for her future and that of her family.

Miss Majanen is also heading off this year. She plans to return to University in Glasgow to do a master's degree and I am sure she will be as dedicated to that as she has been to the pupils she has taught in Kinlochbervie. We wish her every success in her academic career and beyond.

Sr Alzolar also left us at the end of the term. (or perhaps a day or two early) He has spent his probationary year with us and has proved himself to be an excellent teacher and a well-liked and respected colleague, but family ties are taking him back to Spain. Who knows, maybe we will see him back here sometime.

Mrs Strachan, who was covering Ms Richard's maternity leave has left us and we are delighted that Ms Philip will fill the gap until Ms Richard's returns in October.
