a. Durness

Wish for Mr McRae, Active School Coordinator, to return to Durness School and nursery again. Unfortunately, this is unworkable due to his remit which

states he must only work with pupils out with their normal class time. There was also an issue with payment for his travel. He is therefore unable to travel to Scourie or Durness anymore. All pupils will have the opportunity to join one of Mr McRae's activity groups in Kinlochbervie on Thursdays.

Parents were keen to know if there would be a Christmas play / show this year; it was confirmed that there would be.

7. High School

Parents were keen to know how the rewards system in the High School works for pupils to qualify for the end of year school trip. There was feeling from parents that it is not a fair system and is unachievable for some pupils. Staff explained that it is a rewards system based on points which are achieved by receipt of merit certificates, green cards, praise cards, good attendance, participation and commendations from teachers. There was discussion whether a reward trip should happen at all when pupil numbers are so low. It was suggested that the new Pupil Council should discuss what they feel a fair rewards system would look like. Staff also emphasised that the trips to Ridgway Adventure and Stirling / Edinburgh were for all pupils in the appropriate age group and had excellent attendance.

Current S1 parents praised the P7 to S1 transition as being very successful this year. Transition from nursery to P1 was also praised.

Parents asked whether there would be work experience offered to pupils as in previous years. The previous model of S3 pupils spending an allocated week doing work experience will not be reinstated. Pupils are instead encouraged to think of when and where they want to do work experience that is relevant to their future plans / ambitions. This will be supported by the school.

There is a webinar for anyone interested in the pupil trip to Morocco. This trip is open to current S3-5 pupils and will take place at the end of June/ beginning of July 2024. School funds / whole school fundraising will not support this trip. Pupils are instead encouraged to self-fund their trip by working part-time out with school and fundraising either as a group or on their own. The trip is likely to cost in the region of £2000 per pupil. There was discussion about whether this is an achievable trip for most pupils due to the cost. Further information is available in the Head Teacher's report and any pupil who is interested, but concerned about fundraising, should contact Graeme Smart directly.

Head Teacher's Report

Staffing:

Towards the end of last term we had a group of pupils visiting Farr High School for an opportunity to meet with Nicky Grant, our Executive Chief Officer for education. Nicky is a former professional footballer, so our pupils played a match with her joining our team. After a discussion with our pupils and those from Farr the head teacher from Farr and I spoke with Nicky about some of the issues associated with being a very small school and in particular the uncertainties about staffing from one year to the next when our staffing is allocated based on our roll. Nicky agreed that we could keep the same staffing allocation for the next five years regardless of any fall in roll. This in effect means job security for the staff we currently have in post and a guarantee of consistency in subject offerings for at least the next few years. Of course staff move on and we may still face issues around recruiting to part time posts but at least we will be in a position advertise early and have some certainty at the end of each session.

Kim Richards is currently on maternity leave (she has had a baby girl) and the art teaching part of her post is being covered by Lesley Strachan who will be with us one day per week until October at least. Miss Rachel Teague took up her post as teacher of Music this week and will work in the high school and with the primaries, travelling to Durness and Scourie once a week.

Mrs MacFarlane has now left us and her role as PT ASN will be taken on by Dan Price Davies who will now be PT Support and Guidance. Mrs Price Davies is currently working as an Additional Support Needs teacher, and we hope to have her with us on a permanent basis very soon.

Rodrigo Sisdeli has joined us as a teacher of Spanish and is working both with us and with the Highland Virtual Academy.

We are currently advertising a PSA post for 20 hours to replace Kerry who is on maternity leave.

SQA Results:

Our pupils sat exams at National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher this year and for many of them these were the first formal exams they had sat following the cancellation of exams in the last two years. We had an excellent set of results with all our leavers being able to go on to their chosen courses and destinations.

Edinburgh/Stirling trip:

This was a huge success with S1 - 3 pupil spending 3 night sand four action packed days in Edinburgh and Stirling with visits to theatre, book festival castle and Wallace monument

among the highlights. The feedback from pupils and staff was hugely positive and we hope that this will become a regular feature in the school year.

Morocco:

Plans are under way to organise an adventure of a lifetime with a joint venture between Farr and ourselves. A webinar is scheduled for next week and we would encourage any parents to join in to find out more.

Head Pupil Team:

Olivia McCaul will be our Head Pupil this year with Millie Munro and Amy McCaul as her deputy head pupils. All three submitted very thoughtful and mature applications and I am confident we have a team which will achieve a great deal in the year ahead.

Pupil council:

I have asked Olivia and Harvey MacDonald to form the new pupil council with representatives from each year group and from the primary 7's. The pupil council is an opportunity for the pupils' voices to be heard and for them to help form school policy on any areas where they see a need for change or innovation. I look forward to working with them in the coming year.

Extended Management Team Remits:

We met recently as an extended management team to re-allocate many areas of our remits following staffing changes and these will be published on the schools website shortly. I also hope to be able to create an additional PT post which will be advertised internally and the successful candidate will take on a remit which will also be published on the website.

North West Sutherland Schools Early Learning & Childcare Report to parent council 14th September 2022

Staffing

Scourie welcomed Lynzi to the setting in a full-time capacity at the start of term, meaning that Scourie now has a straight ELC class rather than the previous Early Level Class. Lynzi's move to Scourie resulted in a vacancy coming up in Durness which is currently being advertised with the closing date being Monday 19th Sept. This vacancy has been covered in the interim by Demi Eastcroft on a supply basis, but this is Demi's last week with us, so we wish her all the best with whatever comes next & thank her for all the work she has put in across our various settings.

The Durness post also includes one day (4hrs on a Friday) in Scourie to make it a 28hr post, but this can be done as a job-share if that were appropriate.

Leanne & Kris remain in Durness ELC as permanent staff, whilst Gladys & Iona are in Kinlochbervie. There is currently a 4hr vacancy in KLB, which has been advertised twice but it has failed to attract any applicants, yet. This is to cover lunch breaks so needs to be 1 hour per day.

<u>Roles</u>

The current roles for each setting are: Durness ELC – 4 children Scourie – 4 children KLB – 4 children

There are some expected additions to the role over the course of the year.

Newsletter

Latest newsletter for ELC settings has been shared via Seesaw and contains reminders about drop of times & returning completed paperwork. Seesaw continues to be the main form of communication with families.
